# An agile organization, evolving with our world

In April 2022, GMI was the only nonprofit organization **invited by MIT** (Massachusetts Institute of Technology) **to present on best practices** in mentorship for refugee learners. GMI was represented by our CEO and two bright program graduates. In 2023, GMI will continue to use its platform to **amplify refugee voices**.





In June 2022, GMI launched an **Employment Connections Platform** to leverage our corporate partnerships and network to amplify employment opportunities for program graduates. In 2023, GMI will migrate this resource to an interactive platform, further facilitating connection between GMI program graduates and the companies ready to hire them.

In September 2022, GMI launched a **French-language mentorship program.**Language shouldn't be a barrier to accessing opportunity, and GMI is stives to make the program available in additional languages, with plans to launch Spanish next.




